

PE and Sports at William Booth Primary School

End of Year Impact Statistics: 2015-16

The school has achieved **Silver** status through the School Games Kitemark initiative, in conjunction with the Department of Culture, Media and Sport, the Youth Sport Trust and Sport England. This is in recognition of our commitment to and development of competition, school sport and physical education.

Over **90%** of pupils said that they thought their PE lessons were very good and that they really enjoyed them.

100% of staff felt that the PE and Sports provision was a strength of the school.

100% of staff believed that their pupils benefit directly from the Sports Premium funding.

100% of the staff that have worked with Adam McGrory felt that they can now deliver good or outstanding PE lessons themselves.

107 children attended at least one Sports or PE after-school club regularly – the highest amount ever and **69%** of all children in Key Stage 2.

35 children took part in at least one inter-school competitive fixture or tournament, including **70%** of the children in Year 6 and **4** gifted and talented children from Years 3 and 4.

All children in Key Stage 2 are assessed at the start and the end of the year, using the Aviva Sportshall Pentathlon Awards levels.

96% of pupils made at least one level of progress over the year.

60% of pupils made more than 3 levels progress in a single academic year.

56% of pupils in Year 6 achieved a **Bronze, Silver** or **Gold Award** level.

3 of those children achieved a **Silver** award.

7 children in Year 4 and **2** children in Year 3 achieved their **Bronze** award.
