**Achievements:**

- All children received high quality teaching for P.E. curriculum. During the lockdown, children continued to receive a range of lessons via class dojo to ensure they continued with their PE curriculum.
- A range of afterschool clubs were offered by both teaching staff and outside providers.
  - An extremely successful sports week.
- High quality equipment to allow teachers to continue practicing skills learnt across the week ensuring children are active for at least 30 minutes a day.
- PE coach completed level 5 certificate in primary physical education specialism.

**Next steps:**

- Enter competitions across the city allowing children the chance to showcase their talents.
  - Continue with high quality teaching.
- A range of enrichment opportunities with outside providers visiting school and children visiting sporting venues.
- New equipment to be installed to allow further opportunities for children to ensure they are active throughout the school day.
